- Student Application, with a non-refundable \$50 application fee; this reserves your child's spot in our classroom. If you are re-enrolling, this is due by the end of February.
 - A copy of a recent progress report (if coming from a public school)
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Our acceptance process

Our goal is to balance our classrooms in terms of age, gender, race, Montessori experience, and individual needs. Fiddlehead encourages diversity in its students, staff, and parent community.

We screen students for their ability to function independently in a Montessori classroom through observation and discussions with parents and teachers. Thus, enrollment is a juggling act depending on who applies when.

After we complete this process, we will contact you to let you know if your child has been accepted to Fiddlehead.

 - Complete set of supplies (See this year's Supply List. If you don't bring everything, we have to keep track of what you still need and bug you about it. Please save us all the time and hassle.)
